Position Title: Care Manager

The University of Illinois Counseling Center is looking to hire a care manager. The care manager is a generalist who shares clinical responsibilities along with coordinating campus and community resources for students. A successful candidate will have solid experience and expertise in serving college student populations. The Center is an APA accredited training site with over 50 staff, which includes clinicians, doctoral interns, academic professional staff, and administrative staff as well as graduate assistants, undergraduate paraprofessionals, and practicum counselors.

The University of Illinois is located in the twin cities of Champaign and Urbana in central Illinois. The campus is located between the three major metropolitan areas of Chicago, Indianapolis, and St. Louis and is considered one of the top comprehensive research public universities in the nation. Our staff works on campus with an academically talented and ethnically diverse student population, including 24 percent international students, 15 percent Asian students, 9 percent Latino/a students, and 5 percent African American students, for a total enrollment of over 44,880 students. The University of Illinois is a traditional residential campus with nearly 10,500 students living in campus housing.

Primary Job Functions

The primary function of this position is to ensure students are connected with and linked to the needed campus and community resources that best serve the needs of those students. Additionally, the successful candidate will be a well-rounded professional, who works comfortably both individually and as a team member in providing effective clinical, outreach and prevention work. Our Center's mission places a high value on serving a diverse population of students in a culturally competent manner as we provide a variety of services to assist students with psychological, educational, social, and developmental concerns. Job duties and responsibilities as a clinical counselor may include, but are not limited to:

Job duties and responsibilities for this position as a care manager may include, but are not limited to:

- Assess the needs of students in regards to campus and community resources and make the appropriate referrals.
- Assist students to plan, coordinate, advocate and navigate through referred services on campus.
- Follow up with students and clinical staff in regards to referral services and conduct ongoing assessment to determine continued needs.
- Collaborate with campus and community programs/services and advocate for students and their needs as appropriate.
- Collaborate with campus partners, staff/faculty, and parents as appropriate.
- Maintain continuity of care for students by providing support and coordination of care and services with other mental health professionals.
- Coordinate, maintain and update the campus and community referral database.

Job duties and responsibilities for this position as a generalist clinician may include, but are not limited to:

- Providing assessment and time-limited counseling services for individuals and couples.
- Managing clinical crisis and triage services.
- Providing group counseling services through a general therapy group or a group that addresses a specific clinical issue or the needs of a particular population of students.

- Providing outreach and clinical services that address the needs of the general student population as well as the needs of traditionally underserved populations.
- Participating in psychological emergency and trauma response.
- Training/supervising doctoral interns, practicum counselors and undergraduate paraprofessional service providers.
- Participating in other outreach, training, and consultation team activities.
- Participating in various Student Affairs activities and committees.
- Other duties as assigned.

Education

- For clinicians having a terminal degree: master's degree in clinical psychology, clinical/community psychology, counseling psychology, social work or related field is required
- Degree completed by start date is required.

Licensure

- License or license-eligible background as an LPC, LSW, or LCSW is preferred.

Experience

- Demonstrated experience functioning at a high level as a generalist counselor in a diverse setting is required.
- Demonstrated interest, expertise, and experience in case management in a mental health setting is required.
- Previous experience in a college counseling center preferred.

May 16, 2017 or mutually acceptable date.

Appointment Terms

12 months with 24 vacation days; full-time, visiting position that may become a regular position at a later date.

Salary

Salary competitive and commensurate with experience.
